Foundation stage, Key Stages One and Two

Aim: to create a garden which will facilitate children's learning through talk, play and environmental awareness

Grow your own Fruit and Vegetables
Install raised beds, buy tools, seeds, propagators, cold frames, fruit trees and bushes

You may, of course, apply to create any other type of garden or area that your school needs. We do look more favourably at schemes that involve planting rather than just bought play equipment. We hope some of our ideas below will inspire you.
